1-2:30 p.m. A. *Core Dementia Care™: A CMP Funded Dementia Education Initiative*

Speaker: Stacey Starling, PhD; Principal, Starling Center; Project Manager, Core Dementia Care

Overview: Consistent with the Nursing Facility Enrichment Program, this project proposes to implement the Core Dementia Care™ (CDC) QAPI training model that will improve individualized care and enhance person-centered dementia-capable culture. The project will enable SNF staff to effectively modify strategies to discover what contributes to the resident with dementia feeling content, engaged, and enriched in everyday life. Learned strategies improve efforts to prevent or avoid unnecessary pain and suffering for the person with dementia. Research suggests approximately 64% of SNF residents have dementia. Our consortium of content experts, researchers, and experienced educators are uniquely qualified to implement this evidenced informed person-centered dementia care training, sustained by systemic Master Trainer and Train-the-Trainer components. A robust outcomes measurement will examine results in resident enrichment, care outcomes, and staff stress reduction.

Overview: This case-based presentation will test your knowledge of wound care through an interactive challenge of 13 real-life scenarios in the nursing home setting. Some of the topics covered include: treatment strategies; wound types including pressure, venous, arterial, neuropathic, post-surgical, infectious, and atypical; dressing treatment selection; offloading and pressure relief; F-686; assess infection control and wound rounds; litigation and state survey risks; and the importance of documentation and impact on PDPM.
